Tereza Pentzopoulou-Valala is Professor Emerita of Philosophy at Aristotle University of Thessaloniki, where she taught philosophy from 1973 to 2001. In 1995 she was elected a Correspondent Member of the *Academy of Athens*. She was President of the *Greek Philosophical Society* (1989-1991), Vice President (2000-2006) and since 2006 re-elected General Secretary of the Society for Macedonian Studies. She is Vice President of the *Greek Society for*

Aesthetics (EEA) and representative of the Society in the General Meeting of the International Society for Aesthetics. She was elected General Secretary of the Association of Societies for the Interbalkan Co-operation of Women and the Centre of UNESCO and is now Honorary Secretary of the Association and the Centre of UNESCO. She was awarded by the French Government with the medal Chevalier de l'Ordre National du Merite, for the promotion of cultural and scientific relations between Greece and France. Tereza Pentzopoulou-Valala is also an Honorary Member of the Interdisciplinary Centre for Aristotle Studies, AUTH. She taught philosophy at the Universities of Strasbourg, Dijon and Montpellier. In 2001 she was Invited Lecturer of the "Alexander S. Onassis" Public Benefit Foundation of New York lecturing on ancient philosophy and ancient culture for a month at American universities. She has a significant writing and research work. Her studies have been published in the Kant-Studien, Fichte Studien, Etudes Philosophiques, Phaenomenologica Analecta, Philosophy of the Academy of Athens.
